- No prerequisites; previous IEW experience strongly advised
- Concurrent or previous enrollment in an Analytical Grammar class strongly advised
- Course prepared with distance-learning backup via Zoom

Students must have email and Internet access for the following purposes:

- Students will usually write by hand during class but will submit homework via Google Docs or MS Word email attachments.

- In the event of weather or health emergencies, unforeseen library closings, or teacher illness, classes will be held online (during the usual class hour or rescheduled as necessary) via **Zoom**.
- In the event of student absences, with forewarning I may be able to video-record specific lessons. Recordings will be accessible via **Google Classroom**.
- I will provide detailed instructions for each of the above as needed.

Class summary.

The High School Essay Intensive is a combination DVD seminar (led by Mr. Andrew Pudewa, IEW's founder) and teacher-led class. The lessons provide hands-on, practical experience in high school essay writing, including text analysis, response-to-literature prompts, and the personal essay for college/university applications. The content also addresses the new ACT® and redesigned SAT®, offering tools and tips for student success in the timed essay portions of those tests.

This course is divided into four sections:

- 1. General principles of essay composition: Coming up with, organizing, and presenting ideas in effective ways; can be applied to multiple writing tasks in high school and post-secondary experiences
- 2. Essay for the ACT (also helpful for AP exams)
- 3. Essay for the SAT (also helpful for AP exams)
- 4. Personal essay: writing geared toward college and scholarship applications

Although is not necessary for the student to have IEW Style and Structure experience to enroll in this course, a familiarity with IEW and its concepts and methods will be beneficial. If needed, ask to borrow a copy "Style and Structure Overview" DVD from the instructor to prepare for the class.

The High School Essay Intensive class for grades 10+ features the following:

- You may expect 3-5 hours of homework each week.
- Students will learn and be held accountable for MLA formatting and citation as necessary.

This HSEI class is best suited for students in 10th grade or higher who

- Can easily identify the basic 8 parts of speech
- Can confidently recognize and form complete sentences of varying structure, understand the rules of sentence agreement, and maintain consistency in verb tense
- Can hand-write relatively quickly for notetaking, outlining, and drafting during class
- Are preparing for post-secondary education
